Marginalized Voices

As a publishing house, we are in a unique position to help discover and amplify today's marginalized voices. Our hope for these works is to bring about more understanding, empathy, and opportunities for those populations.

For the first two submissions, we are specifically seeking out the unheard voices of emerging authors. Submissions should be between 45,000 and 80,000 words in the following genres:

1. Literary fiction by African American women.
2. Memoir or narrative nonfiction by Muslim women.

Cultural, Developmental, and Religious Topics

The following eight topics explore Epiphany's core themes. We are completely open about form, style, and length. Submissions should explore the following open-ended topics and questions:

Psychology / Sociology

3. The psychology of political values: What developmental/experiential influences shape the formulation of our political views, and what kind of influences/dissonance must we experience to change those views?

Religion

4. The history and evolution of the concepts of Heaven and Hell in the Abrahamic faiths.
5. Mindfulness in various religious traditions: What mindfulness practices, champions, and principles are found throughout the major (and minor) religious traditions of the world? Where do these phenomena converge (and diverge)?
6. Buddhism and Christianity dialogue: What practices are available for those that live in the overlapping margins of these two traditions?

7. Secular Buddhism: What meaningful and transformative practices exist for Buddhists that do not believe in rebirth or karma? What does personal growth and development look like in this secular paradigm?

8. The faith of the "Nones": What does meaningful spirituality look like for the rising population of individuals with the religious preference of "none"?

Christian Theology

9. Process theology: What is the relationship between process theology and religious pluralism?

Christian Living / Devotionals

10. A 365-day devotional that provides insight, reflection, and encouragement from the scriptures.
